CLINICAL TRAINING PROGRAMS

PAETC offers clinical training programs for busy practitioners on the most current information regarding management of HIV-infected patients and interventions to prevent transmission. Training is adapted to high, medium, or low volume providers.

Trainings include:

- Lectures and didactic seminars
- Workshops, seminars and hands-on clinical experience
- Intensive clinical rotations, preceptorships and mini-residencies
- Clinical consultation on all aspects of managing patient care
- Technical assistance to ensure quality of care

PAETC faculty are recognized clinical care experts and include physicians, nurse practitioners, nurses, pharmacists and dentists. INFORMATION DISSEMINATION

Questions about care often arise due to the complexities of HIV infection.
